Together we are creating a global community of practice devoted to the craft of transforming people into stronger leaders, building a more just and sustainable world, and restoring the cultural fabric.

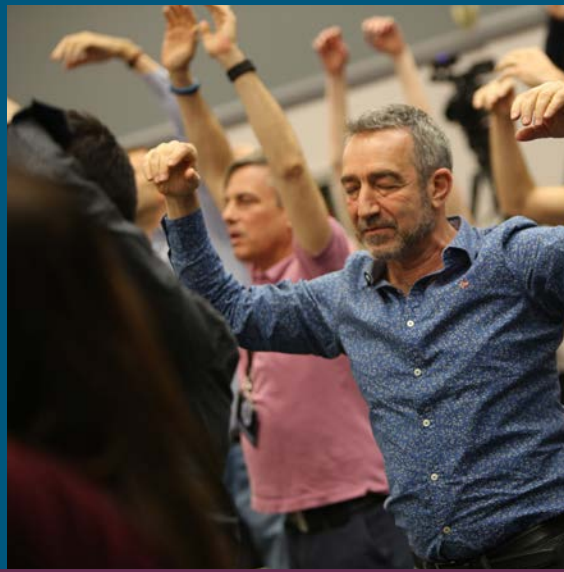
For the past several years we have conducted a week-long professional development immersion outside of Boston. 2022 marks our fifth year hosting the annual NPI celebratory and learning event.

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2022 ANNUAL GATHERING | PROGRAM TRACKS

Participants in the 2022 Annual Gathering can select from one of nine tracks for the week. There are a limited number of spaces for each track. When registering, please select a first and a second choice. To guarantee your selection, we encourage you to sign up early!



TRACK 1: Designing and Leading Systems Change with Dr. Gisela Wendling and David Sibbet

Dr. Gisela Wendling is a visionary anthropological theorist on ritual, lineage and community in organizations, and an expert in leading systemic change. Her Liminal Pathways Framework offers an archetype for change that integrates working with inner process dynamics as well as the outer holding structures required for transformations at the individual leader, group, and organization level. David Sibbet, is an organization development consultant and recipient of the OD Network lifetime achievement award in 2013 for his contributions to visual facilitation, teaming, strategy and change. Together they will guide participants to apply their integrated approach with facilitative and dialogic practices to help practitioners discern organizational narratives, guide their clients to perceive what is emerging, and to give expression to freshly imagined future scenarios.



TRACK 2: Adaptive Leadership and Alignment to Change with Zander Grashow

Co-author of the seminal book *The Practice of Adaptive Leadership*, Zander delves into the art and practice of individual and collective evolution based on thirty years of research at Harvard University. This track provides an evolutionary change framework to determine the parts of the work to carry forward, how to advance among competing priorities and what new capacities are required. We will also explore the intersection of mobilizing external change and mobilizing ourselves. A globally recognized authority on leadership, Zander has been a trusted advisor and partner to Presidents, activists and change agents in their most critical moments of transformation.



TRACK 3: Resilience, Wellbeing and Purpose in Business with Andrew White and Sophie Maclaren

Informed by the latest findings from research into neuroscience and leadership, participants will be guided to practice and apply a range of meditation and mindfulness methods. This session has been designed for seasoned coaches and facilitators who want to help senior leaders develop their individual resilience, restore collective wellbeing, and deepen a shared sense of organizational purpose. This track is led by Saïd Business School faculty Andrew White, Senior Fellow in Management Practice (Leadership), and Visiting Fellow Sophie Maclaren, who is also Director of Awaris UK, where she leads mindfulness, resilience and wellbeing programs.



TRACK 4: Advanced Coaching and Somatics Training with Jennifer Cohen

Certified a Master Coach by the Strozzi Institute, Jennifer will dive into the latest from neuroscience and somatics to help you gain a grounded understanding of what makes working with and through the body so powerful in effecting long-lasting and sustainable change. This track will offer a heightened sense of leadership presence, embodiment and inspiration for your own leadership journey, as well as extend and deepen your coaching skills. (Some experience as a coach or trusted advisor required.)



TRACK 5: Team Coaching with Alexander Caillet & Amy Yeager

Team coaching is the dynamic, complex and enlivening practice of working with a team in real time, on real work, to achieve real, measurable results. Alexander Caillet's pioneering approach — established more than 25 years ago and since refined in collaboration with Amy Yeager, has been used with hundreds of teams internationally and taught to thousands of practitioners. Participants who take this track will get hands-on experience with this powerful discipline, utilizing time-tested frameworks, tools, and methods for assessing and improving team performance.



TRACK 6: Working with Different Parts of the Self with Dr. Richard Schwartz

Renowned family therapist and trauma expert, Dick Schwartz, is regarded as a pioneer for developing the Internal Family Systems (IFS) model. In this track you will apply the IFS model to yourself to identify and integrate your sub-personalities or parts of yourself and learn to access your larger, wiser "Self." You will also learn to guide your clients as part of your coaching practice to begin to know and work with their protective parts. IFS offers a profound yet highly practical method for learning from and managing often competing parts of ourselves that can block our progress in life and trigger us in our interactions with others.



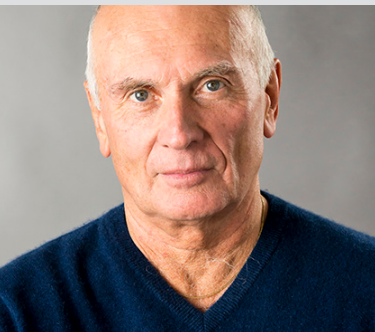
TRACK 7: Organizational & Personal Healing with Constellation Principles with Ester Martinez

Ester brings twenty years of experience as a psychotherapist, constellations expert and as a mystical student of Thomas Huebl. As a senior transformational faculty member of Mobius, Ester serves as faculty for our CEO program conducted with Egon Zehnder (Executive Breakthrough Program) and as a core practitioner in our executive retreat practice where she guides global leaders. This track explores the systematic principles operating within all human systems, whether family, teams or organizations. We will explore the invisible realms — the chords that guide so many of the visible symptoms we encounter. This session will lift the veil and ignite your own deep healing process as well.



TRACK 8: Leading from the Future through Imagination, Intuition, Inspiration and Intention with Robin Alfred

Given the times we live in, increasingly leaders must operate from a place of sensing, intuiting and responding rather than predicting, planning and controlling. In this track Robin will facilitate an exploration of the true nature of the Future; the role intuition, imagination, inspiration and intention play; and how to access these elements to help clients catalyze a regenerative future. We will also look at what blocks us, including individual, collective, and ancestral trauma, so that we learn to integrate and transform what gets in the way of listening to the future. Robin is a seasoned trainer, facilitator and organizational consultant who has extensive experience in facilitating personal discovery, depth work and collective group intelligence, to enable emergence and the manifestation of transformational fields.



TRACK 9: The Maturing Masculine Soul with Dr. Paul Dunion (men-only track)

Paul Dunion has been in private practice as a psychological healer since 1982, when he also began facilitating Men's groups. His work includes individual therapy, working with trauma, and the soul work he details in his collection of books. This is an extraordinary opportunity for a men-only track helping to explore the old definition of maturing as “happening in the proper time.” One response is that a man welcomes and integrates more of his own soul. This track may be another proper time for a man to deepen and discover an invigorating measure of integrity, authenticity, courage, and compassion. Participants will employ the mediums of small group work, storytelling, guided meditation, ritual, psychodrama, journal writing, drawing, and didactic presentations.

MONDAY EVENING:

Professor Tom Malone, *How Hyperconnectivity is Changing the Way We Solve Problems*

A presentation from the founding director of the MIT Center for Collective Intelligence, and the author of the fascinating books *Superminds*, *The Future of Work*, and *Handbook of Collective Intelligence*. Groups of people and computers working together can act more intelligently than any person, group, or computer has ever done before – and together they are about to make many more of our most important decisions as the world undergoes a giant digital transformation.



TUESDAY MORNING:

Bill Torbert, *Action Inquiry, Organizational Learning and Mutual Power*

Professor Emeritus of Leadership at Boston College, Founding Co-Director of Global Leadership Associates, and the author of numerous books, Bill Torbert is best known for his pioneering developmental models of leadership, organizational transformation, and social science – named Collaborative Developmental Action Inquiry. CDAI triangulates among first-, second-, and third-person action inquiry and integrates single-, double-, and triple-loop learning at the individual and collective level – most comprehensively presented in his new memoir, *Numbskull in the Theatre of Inquiry: Transforming Self, Friends, Organizations, and Social Science*.



TUESDAY AFTERNOON:

Dr. Steven Hassan, *How to Determine the Integrity and Trustworthiness of Spiritual Teachers and Communities*

Dr. Hassan is one of the world's foremost experts on mind control, cults and similar destructive organizations. Having served as an advisor to family members, and a thought leader, researcher, and mental health practitioner for many decades, he has devoted his life's work to helping people harmed by such experiences. He directs the Freedom of Mind Resource Center, a counseling and publishing organization outside of Boston, teaches at Harvard Medical School and Brigham and Women's Hospital, and has authored books such as *Combating Cult Mind Control*. He will discuss how to assess the integrity and trustworthiness of spiritual paths and the hallmarks of mind control organizations.

We welcome distinguished thought leaders and pioneering voices in the field of transformational leadership to inspire us and advance our learning.

Professor Andrew Szegedy-Maszak, *Lessons from the Ancient Greeks and their Gods*

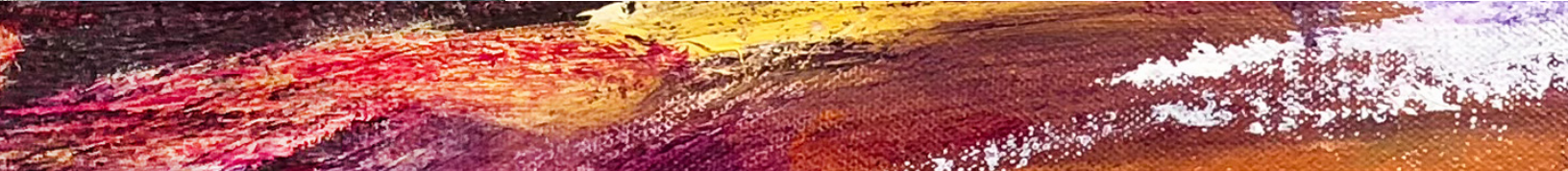
A special group session with Thomas Huebl

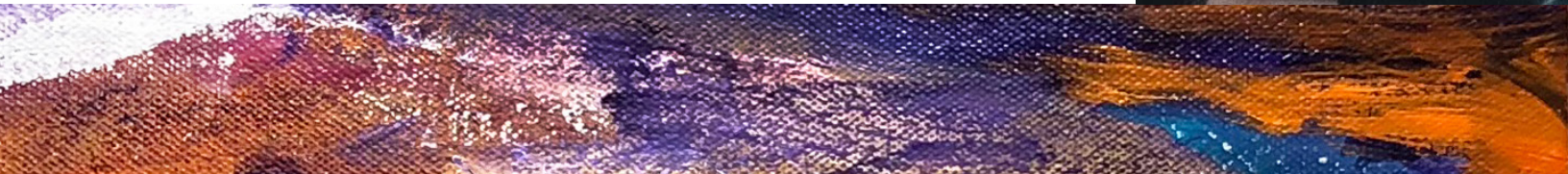

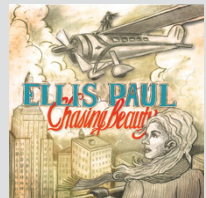
Some artists document their lives through their music. Others chronicle their times. Paul is that rare artist who does both.
